A former player for John Goelz at Sonoma State, White handles many of the on-field responsibilities, with a primary focus on infield play. In addition to his coaching duties, White also oversees the maintenance of Seawolf Diamond's carefully manicured infield and teaches weight training courses as part of the SSU faculty.

A 1990 graduate of Saugus High, White began his playing career at College of the Canyons where he played from 1991-92. Following his time at the junior college level, White joined SSU and was the starting shortstop in 1993 and 1994. A kinesiology major, he earned his bachelor's degree in 1994 from SSU.

After his stellar playing career at Sonoma State, White was drafted in the 32nd round of the 1994 draft by the Florida Marlins. He went on to spend five seasons in the Marlins' farm system, where he was named to the Midwest League All-Star team in 1996. After a productive season in Portland (AA) in 1998, the Marlins dealt White to the Diamondbacks. He went on to spend three seasons in the Diamondbacks' organization at Tucson (AAA).
